

Well, it is a new year and, with it, new opportunities to fulfill our greatest mission of all: CHARITY. To those of you who repeatedly step forward, a sincere thank you. To those of you who mean to do so, thanks for joining in. For those of you who have not, please commit one additional hour a month to acts of Charity, be it a Knights' function or some other way of helping those in need.

As we begin the new year, think of all the things you can do.

Here are examples of the Knights' projects and events I look forward to in 2024:

Our first live Exemplification (Jan. 29) in years. I am inviting all those, including me, who obtained their degrees online to attend this event.

A more accurate signup Genius process. In 2023, we remained focused on our mission of Charity. And our volunteer efforts reflect a tremendous number of hours toward that goal. I am planning a better signup Genius process, so we do not have to make a multitude of changes.



Our spring wives' event where wives come to an abbreviated dinner meeting and social gathering. At this meeting, I would like to kick off discussions of a program called the Columbiettes, a unified body of Catholic women who work side-by-side with the Knights of Columbus.

Our Lenten Fish Fry events where we work in tandem with SPJII on three Fridays during Lent to provide a delicious fish dinner to parishioners and the public.

Spring Pickleball tournament - while we are still not sure if the courts will be available this spring because of construction, alternatives may be available so we can try to produce income from the event.

Spring Golf Outing on May 17 - we are looking for help with marketing to businesses, individuals, and Knights to take part as sponsors, players, and volunteers. We hope to have 50% participation this year from Council 16492. All proceeds go to the Light to the Nations Capital Campaign.

Various color corps events - We will be asked to present colors and march in events again this year. If you are a 4th degree Knight and are in the Color Corps, make sure you participate. Last year only a small number of Sir Knights volunteered for the events. If you are not a 4th Degree Sir Knight, you should consider becoming one to fulfill your patriotic calling.

The Citizens with Disabilities Campaign needs a considerable number of volunteers to help us reach our goal of \$8,000. That money is evenly distributed to four local organizations that deal with developmental disabilities.

Special Olympics - Among our more rewarding volunteer opportunities, we are asked to help as timekeepers, athlete support and companionship, cheerleaders, and friends of an amazing group of special athletes.

Spring Recruitment Drive While we have not focused on growing at past rates this year, we do need to keep recruiting and will plan to repeat our Deputy Grand Knight's recorded appeal to join us. We will need volunteers to staff tables outside church after each mass. Date to be determined.

A special thank you: I want to thank all of you who put me on your prayer list. At the time of publication, I will be going through my second of four series of chemo scheduled through February. Please continue to keep all of those on the prayer list in your daily offerings. And thank you to DGK Rich Delgado for so admirably filling in during my absence.

Speaking for myself, I cannot look at an image of the Holy Family as individuals. The Holy Family is always one unit.





KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS UNIFIED PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

"The Eucharist is the source and summit in the life of a Knight. The more we devote ourselves to the Eucharist, the more we will understand what it means to be a Knight." - Supreme Knight Patrick

The Bishops of the United States have invited all U.S. Catholics to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist. As Knights, we should respond to this call for a National Eucharistic Revival, which "...is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery ... by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist" (eucharisticrevival.org).

All Knights are being encouraged to find ways to participate in this revival - individually, as a local council, and at the state level.



Below are some recommendations for this year as we prepare for the National Eucharistic Congress. Pray the Rosary the 12th of each month (in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe 12/12 and Blessed McGivney's birthday 8/12) for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.

Arrive 10-15 minutes early to each Mass to contemplate Jesus' gift of himself.

Offer 5 minutes of prayerful praise after each Mass.

Spend 30 extra minutes every week outside of Mass sitting or kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament.

Attend Daily Mass. On days you cannot, make an act of Spiritual Communion.

Pray for the gift of the Spirit during the National Eucharistic Procession: Starting May 10, 2024, pray the Novena to Holy Spirit in preparation for Pentecost and start of National Eucharistic Procession (May 17th)


